He was with God in the beginning...the word became flesh and lived for a while among us" (John 1:1-2, 14).

"You are to give Him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins" (Mt.1:21B). This is our foundational message and mission—the salvation/reclamation of the lost.

Christmas is a special time of spreading joy and happiness based on the confidence we can have in God's unfathomable love.

Yours is the love made manifest in Jesus Christ.
